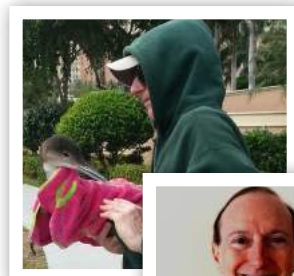
Change is in the Air . . .

A New Day Dawns

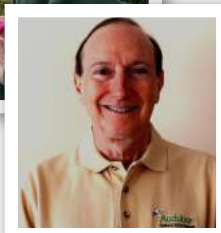

FOHI News

Volunteer Coordinator. At FOHI's annual meeting in September 2017, the board unanimously voted to hire a volunteer coordinator. Announcements appeared on the web, social media, and in local newspapers. A number of qualified candidates applied, but one fit all of FOHI's needs: Tony Ferrara. Tony and his wife Cheryl are moving to Maine. A camper in 2016 and 2017, he will get his feet wet with the Opening Workweek on May 16. Welcome Tony!

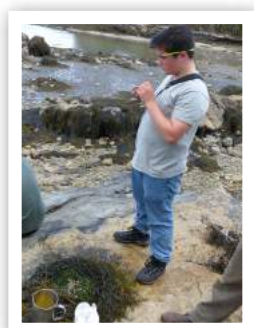

Financials. FOHI's loyal supporters continue to give us and the camp a secure future.

Beside its annual gift of \$50,000 to the camp, FOHI contributed \$11,000 to two much-needed new vans for camp trips; provided three camp scholarships; purchased materials for projects on the island—most noticeable was the new black decking for the pontoon and the refinished floor in the Fish House; purchased kitchen equipment, a wood chipper for trail maintenance, and more. FOHI also paid for mounting three new specimens for the Queen Mary Lab—a Northern Gannet in flight, a Great Blue Heron, and a Great Cormorant. They will fly in for the 2018 session!

We're almost reached our goal of \$1 million for the Hog Island Endowment: we are at \$880,000. Almost there!

Volunteers. Our multi-talented volunteers keep getting better, keep coming back, and keep signing up earlier and earlier. We only have a few spaces left for 2018! We cannot say enough about their dedication and passion for the camp. They give generously and tirelessly of their time—6,700 hours in 2017. Improved work systems throughout the camp allowed a more satisfying experience for all.

Another group of volunteers who make our gardens a joy to behold by their weekly maintenance and by helping Helen Walsh start them in the spring is from the Old Bristol Garden Club. Campers enjoy drawing and photographing them and the visiting butterflies and hummingbirds.



Camp News

Staff. For the 2018 season, we're happy to see Eric, Eva, and Adrian returning. In the kitchen Kristi, who made many of the tasty desserts last year, will return and be co-chef with Anthony Pizzarello, an experienced island chef who is used to the vagaries of the weather and sea. It's going to be another great season with another outstanding team.



Programs. Innovations continue on the program side of the camp. A new online Raptor Rapture course is accepting applicants. Other courses are planned. Two new sessions include "Spring Migration and Monhegan" and "Mountains to the Sea" for teens. The teen trip to Costa Rica is also returning.

The camp's Artist-in-Residence program in 2018 will have three artists staying at the Bingham Cottages, one for a 3-week session and two for 2-week sessions, providing a richer experience for the campers and the artist.

The Hog Island staff and FOHI volunteers continue to make the camper's experience a memory that will last a lifetime and bring a smile.

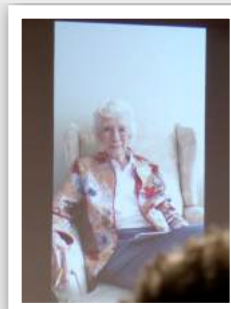

You Rock!



Why do I Volunteer at Hog Island, in Muscongus Bay in Maine?

In a world besotted with self, convenience, instant gratification, and noise, Hog Island just *is*.

A quarter mile offshore, Hog Island’s old growth forest of white pine and red spruce, draped with *Usnea* lichen, harkens in its creaks, groans, and whispers to a time long ago. A time when electricity didn’t exist, no cell phones, no radio, no running water; a time when humans were alert to their natural surroundings, in tune with its rhythms and sounds. The moss-laden trails muffled footfalls on many a rock and twig.

Today, Hog Island is much the same. Its spartan accommodations bespeak of a time when it felt good to be alive, to have survived a cold night, and be rewarded with an *invigorating* cold shower in the morning. Today, cold nights in still spartan rooms are tempered by wool blankets and hot showers. The sunrise knocks on your unadorned window while the winter wren and hermit thrush herald the dawn.

For a week, a lucky few find their way to Hog Island. Arriving weary of the assault of daily modern life, their bodies visibly relax as they step ashore; smiles replace frowns and harried looks. The northern parula foraging in the apple tree, the infinite vista of the island-dotted Muscongus Bay, the unpolluted fresh air, the aroma of home cooking, the smiling faces of staff, instructors, and volunteers, the quirkiness of the 100-year-old buildings, the moss, the lichen, the gardens, together infuse the soul with a warmth and belonging, never to be forgotten.

I’ve volunteered most of my life and have come to rest at Hog Island. I believe that we can make the world a better place by giving of our most precious gift—*Time*. To this day, I cannot think of Hog Island—its mossy paths and old forest, its century-old buildings with all the whispers of the past, and of *all* who have toiled and cared for it—without tears. I cannot imagine the day when I will no longer be able to row across the Narrows and experience the loamy earth and smiles of campers renewing their spirit and awakening to the natural world, when I will no longer be able to give.

Find something you care for deeply and volunteer. You *will* make your world a better place, but take time to look back and see where you started, how far you’ve come, by doing so, the road ahead will be easier and attainable. All the while, you will learn, push yourself and others, and together you will make it happen. Friends of Hog Island did just that. FOHI volunteers donate their valuable summer time with an average of 7,200 hours a season. They passionately give of their *finite* time. They make it happen. So will you.

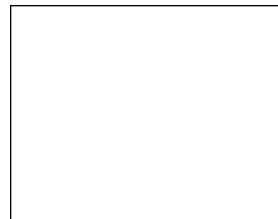
