A Note from the FOHI President . . .

Dear FOHI supporters,

It's the first day of spring as I write this, and while I expect northern New England to throw a few more bouts of winter weather our way, summer is coming. We're all looking forward to the arrival of FOHI volunteers and the first campers at Hog Island, and as was the case in 2021, FOHI

has been working very closely with Eva Matthews Lark, Eric Snyder and the rest of the National Audubon staff to ensure a safe camp season despite the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic.

Last year, FOHI and Audubon jointly designed a cautious, conservative set of Covid protocols and safeguards, which served us well; camp had a perfect record, without a single known case. We're being similarly careful this year, and will adjust what we do and how we respond as the situation warrants. Camp capacity remains somewhat reduced from pre-pandemic years, but with vaccine requirements and masking where prudent we are resuming the use of vans and

dories, while retaining outdoor dining, a change that was enthusiastically embraced by campers, FOHI and staff alike.

As you'll read in more detail elsewhere, we have a changing of guard at FOHI. Our longtime volunteer coordinator Tony

Ferrera, who has done yeoman's work for us for the past four years, has stepped down to spend more time with his wife, enjoying life out by McCurdy Pond. We're delighted to announce that FOHI has hired Adam DiNuovo as our new volunteer coordinator — a name that will be familiar to many of you, since Adam, who worked for National Audubon in Florida,

has been an instructor for many years during Hog Island's seabird conservation sessions. (Special thanks to Tony for his help in getting Adam up to speed during the hectic late-winter period when camp and FOHI registration both opened. We're pleased that Tony will remain involved with FOHI even in his retirement.)

Finally, plans continue apace for raising the Queen Mary, hopefully this autumn after camp has finished. Eric Snyder has been spearheading this enormous undertaking, working with contractors and a number of regulatory bodies whose permits and blessings we need to lift the QM above rising sea levels — a project, as we've noted before, being underwritten by very generous FOHI supporters.

Come on, summer! I can't wait to see many of you this year back on the island.

FOHI in 2021

For FOHI and for the camp, 2021 was a daring year. Not only did the camp operate at half capacity, but rooms were singles except for family, dining was outside — rain or shine, everyone masked and kept socially distanced, campers drove their own cars on field trips, and so much more. Needless to say, we all came through it with flying colors, both FOHI volunteers and Audubon staff made it happen.

Seventy-four volunteers signed up with gusto despite all the paperwork — newcomers and old timers rallied — all eager to

be on the island and enjoying the camaraderie and work. In total, they gave 6,116 hours of their time.

Because of your continued generosity, FOHI increased its annual donation to the camp to \$60,000 from \$50,000. We also purchased items needed for the kitchen and laundry room, including a new washing machine. We are



also starting 2022 with a healthy reserve of \$450,618, which includes restricted funds for the Queen Mary.

We hired a local company, Northeast Media Collective, to redesign our website, which now highlights our digital archive and makes access easier. Take time to explore it and send us your feedback at info@fohi.org. Huge thanks to Jay Collier who hosted our site for so long and was our technical guru.

Our biggest news is about the Queen Mary. FOHI and Audubon attended all the town planning meetings for permitting. At the meeting in early March 2022, we received the news that all requirements had been satisfied; the project was free to move ahead. Eric Snyder, project manager, hopes fall 2022 will see the Queen Mary slowly rise. Thanks to a number of generous donors, FOHI is funding the project including the permitting.

Our new volunteer coordinator, Adam DiNuovo, led a field of excellent applicants. He's now busy with the 2022 sign-ups!

At Hog Island, we never say goodbye, instead we say "see you again soon." So to FOHI board members Charles Duncan and Sarah Matel we say thank you and see you again soon. Sarah had to step down for personal reasons. Charles cycled off. Many thanks to Anthony La Creta for stepping in until a new treasurer is appointed.

Scholarship Recipients 2021

Each season, FOHI gives one or two scholarship for the teen birding camps. We offer them to the Maine Young Birders Club. The recipients for 2021 were Anna Seigel and Eliza Nickelson. Below is a piece that Anna wrote after her session and photo she caught of the osprey carrying a fish!

"I left Hog Island on a cold, drizzly morning with stories to tell my parents, photos to upload and sort, and a new notebook in my backpack. Whenever I want to revisit my fantastic time at the Monhegan and

Hog Island Birding for Teens week this summer, I find that notebook and peruse its pages. Inside is not only the bird lists from our early morning walks but sketches of fungi, interesting moths, and a strange beetle, none of

which I'd have stopped to observe on a typical bird walk. Below these quick studies is a series of numbers, the body

measurements of the American Goldfinches, Purple Finches, and Downy Woodpeckers we banded. I chuckle at the page covered with my distinctive, hurried scrawl, as I tried to write down all the questions I had during Don Lyons presentation on seabird restoration.

The last page of the notebook might be my favorite — small portraits of the friends I made over four days, four days of boat rides, binoculars, and bonding. My Hog Island experience taught me many things, but the most valuable lesson may have been that the young birding community is as enjoyable and welcoming as the birds themselves."

From the Garden Coordinator . . .

Many FOHI gardeners toiled on hands and knees, from May to October, in the ongoing improvement of the camp



landscape. The areas of native plants installed in 2019 were weeded, watered, mulched and amended as some failed while others flourished.

Runaway oregano was painstakingly

dug out of flowerbeds and replaced with native plants friendly to pollinators. Several volunteers (Jan Getgood, Nancy Dickinson, Holly Emmons, Jenny Welch, Helen Walsh, and Scott Weidensaul) raised and donated appropriate perennials. Traditional box gardens and containers were filled with colorful annuals and herbs. Shrubs and trees were planted around the edge

of the island to mitigate erosion and replace blown-down spruce. Heat, drought, and hungry deer were challenges, but our efforts paid off. Many thanks to all those volunteers who helped to keep the gardens watered and weeded!

On the mainland, welcoming perennial borders were lovingly tended, and a new bird-friendly garden designed by Steve Kress was installed by Audubon staff Eric Snyder and Adrian Bregy with FOHI help and donated plants. In the hillside meadow, volunteers tirelessly battled invasive alien weeds, particularly Asian jewelweed. Birds, bees, butterflies and birders all enjoy the benefits!
